# Berberis aristata

### Common names

Tree tumeric (Ireland), Indian barberry (Ireland)

Berberis aristata is a medium sized fully hardy perennial deciduous shrub with yellow flowers in late Spring and mid Spring. The flowers are arranged in a racemose catkin inflorescence. It looks best in Spring and Autumn.

#### Soil

Berberis aristata grows in soils ranging from a pH of 5.5 (very acidic ranges from 5.2 to 5.5) to 7.5 (neutral ranges from 6.6 to 7.5).

#### Growth

This shrub has an ultimate height of 3m / 9.8ft and spread of 2m / 6.6ft. It can take 16-20 years to reach its ultimate height.

#### Leaves

They are oblanceolate in shape.

#### **Scent**

A moderate pleasant scent is emitted from the flower.

#### **Uses**

Fragrance, fruit edible, security/barrier, herbal medicine, flowering shrub, low maintenance, mixed shrub border, woodland margin, bank and slope, basic hedge, screen, wind break and coastal/seaside suitable. Tolerances 2 of 4

Salt/sea spray (medium), deer (high) and wind (high).

## Stem

The green stems have a smooth texture.

# Fruit and seed

The fruit is purple. There is a fruit/seed abundance beginning in Summer and ending in Autumn.
